## **City Commission Information Letter**

## March 11, 2022

## Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Proposed Budget Calendar

With direction currently being offered to prepare for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Proposed Budget considerations, the attached budget and capital improvement program (CIP) calendar was recently finalized so that all departmental leadership can begin preparations accordingly.

As referenced, this exercise likewise includes various revenue and expenditure forecasting guidance, as well as specific instructions for staff relative to infrastructure programming and related enterprise fund transactions. Direction as outlined will therefore enable the Office of the City Manager to make definitive total fund balance budget recommendations by the time an initial submission is offered to the City Commission circa early summer.

Meanwhile, an initial item concerning the upcoming budget process involves an annual goal setting session, to take place during the course of one day, Friday, May 13th. Arrangements are therefore currently being made to secure the services of a professional facilitator for this purpose.

## **Request for Qualification Process to Support Water Treatment Plant Design and Construction Activities**

Now that direction has been formally offered relative to an updated water utility rate structure profile necessary to support development and construction of a new water treatment plant facility (to likewise include accompanying infrastructure), please also be advised that direction is currently underway to engage in a selection process necessary for respective progressive design/build services.

A progressive design/build opportunity as noted would likewise include all phases of project implementation to ensure available economies of scale,

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featuring final cost estimates to ultimately yield guaranteed maximum price considerations, and no change orders to be experienced as a result.

The initial basis of this solicitation involves the attached project timeline matrix report, with the goal of the new facility becoming fully operational in four years. Meanwhile, more information regarding the project implementation scope will be offered during the next few months as recommendations for respective contractual services are made available publicly.

## **Direction to Administer Classification and Compensation Study**

As mentioned publicly during the current fiscal year proposed budget process, a principle task for the Department of Human Resources involves working with all divisions and sections of municipal operations to administer a classification and compensation study.

The purpose of this initiative involves the evaluation of wage and salary profiles for all City of Delray Beach positions and job descriptions to determine market values, as well as to prepare for any compensation adjustments that might be warranted after respective analysis is completed.

The Office of the City Manager and that of Director of Human Resources Duane D'Andrea are therefore currently finalizing contractual service negotiations necessary to proceed as outlined. With the timeframe to conduct the study anticipated at four to six months, resulting financial considerations will become an integral function of the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Proposed Budget process.

## Participation in Florida League of Cities Race to Zero Initiative

In an effort to continue to expand both our organization's and community's efforts relative to sustainability best practices, please be advised that direction is being offered to submit an application for the City of Delray Beach to secure assistance from the Florida League of Cities (FLC) to pursue involvement with the United Nations Race to Zero initiative.

As referenced in the attached program description, participation as noted will offer planning and other assistance necessary to enable the City of Delray

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Beach to identify potential greenhouse gas reduction strategies that may otherwise not be possible. A greenhouse gas inventory was performed by the Department of Public Works a few years ago. Guidance to this effect should likewise yield a favorable consideration from FLC in the coming months.

### **Calendar of Meetings, Activities, and Functions**

In the aftermath of this past Monday's Delray Beach Education Board meeting that included attendance and participation of various area school and district administrators, direction regarding upcoming ancillary discussions has since been offered. This included the dialogue offered by Education Coordinator Janet Meeks during Tuesday's regular City Commission meeting relative to follow-up engagement with the School District of Palm Beach County School Board; regarding existing concerns, as well as concurrent preparation for the April 4<sup>th</sup> meeting to address outstanding issues surrounding the Delray Beach Full-Service Center and its future trajectory.

Otherwise, I thought that Monday's Education Board meeting was a positive experience for all who attended, as I likewise remain hopeful for continued collaborative professional outcomes that will ultimately benefit the cause of education in our community.

The League recognizes that many municipalities want to plan and act on measures to combat this challenge but may lack sufficient resources and support. To help cities that are just starting out on the path to sustainability, the Florida League of Cities is underwriting the costs for 20 municipalities to join the Race to Zero, a friendly competition between municipalities to showcase how they are leading the way to carbon neutrality. The Florida Race to Zero is part of a global Race to Zero campaign to rally leadership and support from businesses, governments, and investors for a healthy, resilient and decarbonized economy. The 20 cities chosen will join a Florida Race to Zero "cohort" – a structured, technical assistance training program that will guide participants toward

- Conducting greenhouse gas inventories and developing science-based targets
- Developing an action plan (including a stakeholder engagement component)
- Implementing the plan
- Reporting results.

The 20 municipalities will:

- Develop a baseline inventory of local greenhouse gas emissions
- Set a 2030 science-based target and identify high-impact actions that align with the global Race to Zero
- Create capacity to act among city staff and elected officials
- Prepare to expand climate action to include adaptation and resilience.

### **Municipal Requirements**

- Letter of support from Mayor or City Manager
- Designate a municipal employee as point of contact and local lead
- Commit 15 hours per month of staff time over the course of the 6-9 month cohort.

Please Note: In order to ensure a diverse and representative sample of cities in the cohort, the League will evaluate submissions based on factors including but not limited to population size, geographic and economic diversity, previous or current resiliency initiatives, etc.
