<u>Architectural Support Services to Help Expedite Completion of Crest Theater Building Renovations</u>

Both the Office of the City Manager and that of Director of Public Works Missie Barletto are pleased to report that leadership of the architectural firm that was involved in the initial phases of implementing the Crest Theater Building Renovation Program, Walters-Zackria, has formally expressed interest to contract directly with the City of Delray Beach to help expedite and finalize improvements accordingly.

As referenced in the attached electronic mail message from Assistant Director of Public Works Cynthia Buisson, direction to this effect specifically involves issuance of the originally signed and sealed architectural drawings, naming the City of Delray Beach as the official "project owner". The significance of this outcome involves a name change to the existing building permit, rather than having to re-engage a new building permit issuance process. With Walters-Zackria's involvement as outlined, we likewise hope to reduce the project completion timeline significantly.

Arrangements are currently being made to execute a respective professional service agreement. Likewise, recommendations to support initial contractor services expenditure approvals are anticipated during the October 11th regular City Commission meeting.

Follow-Up Direction Concerning Municipal Complex Public-Private Partnership Considerations

As staff ultimately prepares for specific transactions to help support a selection process necessary to consider public-private partnership (P3) proposals for the development and construction of a new municipal complex to house both

operations and other related opportunities, please be advised that arrangements are currently being made to host a workshop meeting on the subject during the September 19th session.

As referenced in the attached project outline, this dialogue will likewise include representatives from CBRE, to feature a summary regarding access to private sector capital, applicable redevelopment packaging scenarios (to potentially involve strategies for redevelopment of non or underperforming assets), as well as a potential timeline to recommend partner selection, implementation/construction, and continuous operations.

Selection of New Education and Workforce Development Coordinator

After initiating an external selection process that yielded four finalist candidates for the position of Education and Workforce Development Coordinator (that became available as a result of Janet Meeks' recent announcement of retirement), the Office of the City Manager is pleased to report that interviews necessary to make a selection as noted were successfully concluded earlier this week.

Ms. Cheryl A. Young-Moffett brings to the City of Delray Beach over 12 years of education development, community outreach, and relationship building experiences to the position. Recent professional contributions to this effect involved various non-profit engagement and consultancy services, including organizations such as the School District of Palm Beach County, and the Florida Association of International Bachelorette Program.

A resident of South Florida for numerous consecutive years, Ms. Young-Moffett earned both undergraduate and graduate degrees in organizational leadership from Palm Beach Atlantic University, as well as ancillary educational attainment from Centennial College in Toronto and Ontario, Canada.

Ms. Young-Moffett is currently scheduled to begin service with the City of Delray Beach Monday, September 12th, enabling her ability to directly interact with Ms. Meeks for orientation purposes for nearly two weeks prior to her retirement becoming effective Friday, September 23rd. Ms. Young-Moffett will therefore

also be introduced publicly during the September 19th regular City Commission meeting.

Meanwhile, I wish to offer my appreciation to Assistant City Manager Jeff Oris, Director of Economic Development Sara Maxfield, Director of Parks and Recreation Sam Metott, Director of Neighborhood and Community Services Sammie Walthour, and Assistant Director of Human Resources Dot Bast, for serving as the interview panel for this very important decision-making process.

<u>Initiation of Signage Placement to Support Implementation of Ordinance 25-22 (Prohibition of Smoking in Parks and Beaches)</u>

As committed during the August 16th City Commission meeting relative to positioning signage and other efforts to encourage adherence to the new ordinance that prohibits smoking certain tobacco products in both Delray Beach public parks and beaches, please be advised that arrangements are currently being made to place signage throughout the Delray Beach parks system and public beaches.

The Department of Public Works anticipates signs being produced during the next couple weeks (based on the attached schematic included with today's report). Once delivered, both Public Works and Parks and Recreation will work collaboratively to position stakes and signposts at strategically visible locations in each park. Direction to this effect will likewise also coincide with a public outreach campaign to be conducted by Director of Communications Gina Carter.

Good Afternoon Mr. Moore,

Public Works has met with the original Architect of Record (AOR), Walter Zackria Architects at the Crest Theater to discuss their interest and available options for proceeding as the AOR for this project. Walter Zackria is presently developing a scope and fee to create a punchlist of ongoing, completed and pending project scope and to name the City as the Owner of the Plans which will allow the City to use the existing permit with a Change of Contractor. This process will result in a time savings as we can move forward under the currently issued permit without the need to develop new plans and apply for a new building permit.

Public Works has started coordination with the Finance / Purchasing Department to discuss the contracting mechanism, presently proposed to be a Bid Waiver (Best Interest Resolution). We will be working towards developing an agreement and bringing it forward for Commission review and approval on the October 11, 2022 Commission agenda.
