Responsibilities and Commitments Involving the Recently Announced Florida Resiliency Grant Program Award

With last week's announcement that the City of Delray Beach is being awarded an additional \$12.5 million in grants from the Florida Resiliency Program to help finance various stormwater improvement projects, specifically the Thomas Street Pump Station and the Historic Marine Way Seawall, Roadway, and Drainage Improvement Program, please be advised that this achievement involves a 50% matching contribution from our city.

Directors from the Department of Public Works and the Department of Finance are currently working with the Office of the City Manager to identify strategic opportunities to recommend financial capabilities. Outcomes to this effect will become a function of the City's present consideration to restructure its stormwater utility assessment, as well as other opportunities via state financing programs.

Specific recommendations for City Commission review and consideration will likewise become an integral function of the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Proposed Budget process, including the five-year capital improvement program evaluation exercise.

Selection of New Education and Workforce Development Coordinator

After engaging an external selection process that yielded four finalists for the position of Education and Workforce Development Coordinator, the Office of the City Manager is pleased to report that interviews were successfully concluded last week.

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Ms. Janai R. Bowens brings to the City of Delray Beach over 10 years of educational and workforce development, community outreach, and relationship building experience to our organization. Recent professional contributions involved various public education and non-profit engagement services, including with organizations such as Broward County Public Schools, and Miami-Dade County Public Schools.

A native of South Florida, Ms. Bowens is a highest honors graduate of the University of Florida, having earned a Bachelor of Arts in English from that institution. She also holds graduate degrees in business administration and educational leadership from Florida International University and Florida Atlantic University respectively.

Ms. Bowens is scheduled to begin service with the City of Delray Beach next week, enabling her to begin immediate interaction with leadership of the local education and business communities accordingly. Additionally, via support from Assistant City Manager Jeff Oris, applicable collaboration with the Delray Beach Education Board will soon follow.

Completion of Electronic Knox Cylinder Transition and Installation Activities

Both the Office of the City Manager and that of Fire Rescue Chief L. Keith Tomey III are pleased to report that upgraded locking mechanisms necessary for safe access by first responders to both businesses and residences located in Delray Beach have been successfully implemented.

As referenced in the attached electronic mail message from Fire Marshal Travis Franco, the new product offers state of the art accountability and security, in comparison to previous infrastructure that has been in place and unchanged for over 40 years. Specific enhancements include a more secure system that is less prone to human error, such as lost or misplaced keys. In the event that a key or any other entry mechanism becomes unavailable for whatever reason, the system remains secure and intact as intended.

Operational functionality as outlined became effective several days ago, without any interruptions and/or compromise to service and safety.

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Meanwhile, much appreciation to Fire Marshal Franco and his team for effective completion of this task without a dependence on overtime.

National Transportation Safety Board Partnership to Help Investigate Recent Train Collision

Given the recent tragic train collision at the Florida East Coast Railroad crossing at Lindell Boulevard and Old Dixie Highway that resulted in the deaths of a married couple in our community, the National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) secured the City of Delray Beach's authorization to collaborate with their organization as a partner in the now active investigation.

As referenced in the attached electronic mail message from Director of Public Works Missie Barletto, NTSB has provided a preliminary draft report of the incident, formally notifying the City of Delray Beach that the permanent report will include recommendations for structural changes at this particular railroad crossing.

As the City of Delray Beach will likewise need to obligate capital improvement commitments, considerations to fund and schedule as noted involving FEC, will be forthcoming.

Calendar of Meetings, Activities, and Functions

An integral discussion involving the Office of the City Manager's biweekly dialogue with leadership of the Department of Parks and Recreation included a reiteration of commitments to implement additional facility improvements throughout Delray Beach via current fiscal year capital improvement program resources, as well as ancillary opportunities that are to become available if the current general obligation bond issue is approved by voters during the March 14th municipal election.

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Likewise, the community can now look forward to pending improvements and additional recreational facilities at Catherine Strong Park (permanent pickleball court facilities), as well as such for public restrooms located along the beachfront.

Chief Tomey,

Good morning. I want to take a moment to provide an update on the Fire Departments efforts relative to our upgrades to the City's Knox box system. Over the past few months my office has identified an issue with our Knox system and has worked towards finding a permanent solution. The Knox system we had been using was largely unchanged since the 1980's. The system had served us and the residents of the city well over the past 4 decades, operating as intended and allowing for rapid access into structure during emergency calls. As you know when there is emergency seconds matter and over the past 4 decades our Knox system consistently saved us seconds. However, like most things over time a new and better option will present itself. As good as our old system was it did have some concerns relative to key accountability. This concern has impacted Fire Departments all over the nation and Delray Beach Fire Rescue was not immune to these impacts.

Once these concerns were identified swift and decisive action was taken by our agency, with the support of city hall, to ensure these concerns were mitigated. Working with the Knox company, my office identified an upgrade to the existing Knox system. This upgrade will allow for the same level of operational efficiency while addressing the concerns regarding key accountability. This upgrade embraces a new technology and puts our department at the forefront of a progressive movement.

The upgraded system does away with the traditional key concept and moves us to a new electronic key fob. This fob allows for better accountability by requiring a pin code to be entered into the fob before unlocking a Knox box to access the keys to a building. Simply, if you do not know the pin and found the fob on the ground all you have found is a piece of plastic. Further, this new system allows for real time tracking of which of our units opened a Knox box at a specific location, recording the date and time. This level of accountability will ensure that our system functions as intended for decades to come.

I am happy to report that the upgrades to the City's Knox Box system have reached a point where I can declare "project completion". Beginning on February 10th, 2023, my team in the Fire Safety Division took on the monumental task of upgrading our City's Knox box system. As a direct result of their hard work and dedication we completed this undertaking on February 16th, 2023. This was quicker than anyone could have projected including the Knox company. The manner in which we accomplished this will serve as an example for the rest of the county to follow. I cannot express how proud I am of my team for getting this completed in such a fast and professional manner.

The National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) has provided us with a preliminary draft report which describes factual information about the train/vehicle fatality accident at Lindell Road and Old Dixie Highway that has been developed to date. The final report on the investigation, in which the City is a partner, is expected to be released next week. Recommendations for safety improvements at this railroad crossing are expected to be included with the final report.
