City Commission Information Letter

General Obligation Bond Supported Capital Improvement Considerations for the Delray Beach Tennis Center

As discussed during Tuesday evening's City Commission meeting relative to the pending capital improvement program and related projects. To be supported via the upcoming Parks and Recreation General Obligation Bond, specific considerations for the Delray Beach Tennis Center are currently being developed.

As referenced in the attached electronic mail message from Director of Parks and Recreation Sam Metott, the current specific project development outline includes enhancements to restroom facilities, stadium seating, court lighting, and numerous other facility improvements.

Guidance to this effect takes into consideration professional tennis tournament standards for host facilities, whereby the City of Delray Beach will soon be able to proudly share associations with. Progress is being made to enhance future experiences at the Delray Beach Tennis Center accordingly.

Execution of Resident Parking Discount Program

Now that the City of Delray Beach is currently administering the recently revised parking fee structure for locations throughout the community, please be advised that direction is now also being offered to incorporate 50 cent per hour discounts for Delray Beach residents.

Guidance to this effect likewise involves offering recommendations to proceed as noted to the Parking Management Advisory Board, scheduled to take place via its next meeting Tuesday, August 22nd. Following this exercise, considerations as noted will be offered to the Downtown Development Authority Board of Directors, during their meeting next month. Both sessions will simply

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afford opportunities for comment and input, in advance of making discounts effective beginning in October, commensurate with the new fiscal year.

Much like the resident downtown parking permit process, this discount will be applied via the Park Mobile Application. Recognizing discount codes assigned to individual vehicles accordingly.

Community Input Regarding Considerations for an Atlantic Avenue Historic District

As committed publicly during the August 8th regular City Commission meeting direction is currently underway to soon begin external stakeholder meetings for resident and property owner participation and input to ultimately help support an Atlantic Avenue Historic District consideration process.

As referenced in the attached electronic mail message from Director of Development Service Anthea Gianniotes, guidance to this effect involves hosting a historic preservation symposium event to provide City Commission, residents, and stakeholders with crucial information well in advance of formal recommendations accordingly.

With staff currently evaluating the qualifications of external consultants and other experts that may be interested in assisting the City of Delray Beach as outlined, the Historic Preservation Division of the Department of Development Services anticipates hosting a symposium sometime in October.

Special Events Technical Advisory Committee Membership Composition

With revisions to the City's special events policy now being administered (incorporating feedback and guidance offered to this effect via the July 18th workshop meeting dialogue as noted), administrative and operational support to this effect also includes membership additions to the Special Events Technical Advisory Committee (SETAC).

As referenced in the attached electronic mail message from Assistant City Manager Jeff Oris (whose professional role and responsibility likewise now

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includes oversight of SETAC functions and processes), leadership from Parks and Recreation, Public Works, Development Services, Police, Fire, and most recently, the Office of the City Attorney, serve SETAC.

Next week's Executive Leadership Team meeting will likewise include a discussion relative to orientation regarding the updated policy, as well as reemphasis of the importance of keeping SETAC functions a major priority for daily operations interdepartmentally.

Calendar of Meetings, Activities, and Functions

As staff prepares to introduce a report of initial observations and metrics resulting from our recent commitment to participate in the Columbia University City Adaptability Index Survey, a cross-section of the Executive Leadership Team convened with representatives from WGI, Inc. Wednesday morning to offer input accordingly. This included Sustainability and Resiliency Officer Kent Edwards; Assistant City Manager Jeff Oris; Director of Public Works Missie Barletto; Director of Development Services Anthea Gianniotes; Director of Information Technology Jay Stacy; Director of Parks and Recreation Sam Metott; Director of Neighborhood and Community Services Sam Walthour; and, on behalf of Fire Rescue Chief L. Keith Tomey, Assistant Fire Rescue Chief Kevin Green.

Given the productivity associated with this exercise, the Office of the City Manager remains more than happy to commit to a presentation as noted for City Commission during the September 5th regular meeting.

Mr. Moore,

As we strive to make the special event process more effective and efficient, it is important for us to review the Special Events Technical Advisory Committee (SETAC) process. With the addition of a representative from the City Attorney's office, the typical SETAC meeting includes up to 20 members. This includes representatives of the following departments and or divisions and their area of review:

Public Works – Parking – Closure of public parking spaces or reservation of on-street or parking garage spaces. Public Works – Operations – Use of facilities and if there is a need to protect a facility or warn promoters about overuse they will be required to mitigate.

Public Works – Streets – Roadway closures, FDOT permits needed for closures of State roadways, need for safety barricades to protect people/property.

Neighborhood and Community Services – Business Tax Receipts – need for BTR's and Alcoholic Beverage License(s) requirements.

Neighborhood and Community Services – Clean and Safe – Cleanliness needs of events and protection of amenities.

Police – Special Operations Section – Assess potential security and traffic issues, recommend security and traffic control measures, determine police staffing needs.

Fire Rescue – Emergency Management – Assess safety needs based on site plan and anticipated attendance, review of safety plans.

Fire Rescue - Ocean Rescue - Beach safety concerns and safety concerns for runs/walks on A1A.

Neighborhood and Community Services – Business Tax Receipts/Alcoholic Beverage Licenses.

Development Services – Planning – Check on zoning requirements and if type of special event is legally allowed at the site.

Parks and Recreation – Special Events Office – Works as liaison to applicant, utilizes knowledge of City facilities and special event operations to review applications for associated needs.

Parks and Recreation – Maintenance – Effect on property, needs to protect city parks being utilized.

Parks and Recreation – Recreation – Use of specific facilities and input to how events are to operate at individual parks.

Finance Department - Treasurer – Ensures no outstanding invoices, to understand events for cost review and invoicing when events are complete.

Downtown Development Authority – Acts as liaison with events on Old School Square Campus (in conjunction with Special Events Office), reviews use of Old School Square campus, informs SETAC of operational requirements DDA has placed on events at OSS, provides insight related to businesses that may be affected by events within the DDA area.

City Manager's Office – Oversees the SETAC process and reviews applications for more global concerns related to implementation and for items that will require Commission approval.

City Attorney – Clarification of legal concerns, assist in limiting issue of liability to the City, ensure the SETAC process is operating within applicable laws and policies.

I believe it is appropriate at this time to have a discussion regarding the size of SETAC and to determine if there is a more efficient membership composition that can be enacted while still maintaining the high-level of operational knowledge of the current membership.
