City Commission Information Letter

Exit Conference Outcomes Via State Operational Audit of the City of Delray Beach Concerning Town of Highland Beach Agreement

Both the Office of the City Manager and that of Chief Financial Officer Hugh Dunkley wish to report that a productive exit conference with leadership of the State of Florida Office of the Auditor General was concluded this past Monday, yielding the finalization of its review of City of Delray Beach operations and transactions related to the Interlocal Service Agreement between the City of Delray Beach and the Town of Highland Beach for fire rescue services.

As referenced in the attached summary excerpt from Florida Auditor General Sherrill F. Norman, invoices to the Town of Highland Beach were determined to have been calculated based on actual expenditures.

Direction is likewise now being offered to commission external forensic auditing services necessary to determine a precise calculation of balances due to the City of Delray Beach. Final data analysis from this exercise will be reported to the City Commission, enabling considerations relative to mediation and/or other opportunities available to both parties to resolve accordingly.

Meanwhile, much appreciation to the Joint Legislative Audit Committee and allocated staff and resources that worked very closely with members of our team, enabling an objective confirmation of our previous reviews, observations, and analysis as noted.

Delray Beach, Florida Recognition as a Top Ten Digital City

In recognition of various interdepartmental achievements relative to implementing technologies to better serve both residents and stakeholders of our community, the City of Delray Beach is now ranked #4 in the up to 75,000 population category of the "Top Ten Digital Cities" in America.

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As noted in the attached electronic mail message from the publishers of Government Technology Magazine and Vice President of the Center for Digital Government Todd Sander, this accomplishment recognizes Delray Beach as among a distinguished group of cities that have worked hard to improve its digital, citizen, and government experience via technology and leadership. For our organization, this specifically includes the recent implementation of the online permitting system, enhancements to technical infrastructure to improve both cybersecurity and disaster recovery capabilities, as well as enhancements to the City's citizen engagement and digital outreach.

A formal presentation of this award will be made during the November 14th regular City Commission meeting. Additionally, our efforts as outlined will be recognized during the 2023 Digital Cities Survey Awards Event to be held during the National League of Cities 2023 Annual City Summit two days later in Atlanta, Georgia.

Meanwhile, much appreciation to Chief Technology Officer Jay Stacy, Director of Communications Gina Carter, and other members of our team involved in efforts to make the City of Delray Beach worthy of such an honor.

Contractor Selection Process to Implement Marine Way Seawall Improvement Program and Stormwater Pump Station Project

As committed to publicly during the October 10th regular City Commission meeting, direction is imminent to execute a contractor selection process to initiate the Marine Way Seawall Improvement Program.

As referenced in the attached electronic mail message from Director of Public Works Missie Barletto, guidance to this effect involves the selection of a construction engineering and inspection firm, to ultimately be responsible for reviewing construction bids once received by the City of Delray Beach, as well as to perform daily oversight of project construction activities.

With applicable external invitations to be offered during the next couple weeks, award of contractual services is anticipated in early 2024. Concurrently, direction is being offered to advertise an invitation to bid construction for the project, to include creation of a new seawall along North Marine Way, as well as roadway

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improvements, and the first stormwater pumping station west of the Intracoastal Waterway in our community.

<u>Public Input Efforts to Help Initiate Parks General Obligation</u> Bond Projects

As staff prepares for the initiation of financial transactions and the contractor selection process to implement projects relating to the \$20 million Parks Recreation Bond, direction will be offered to include opportunities for communitywide engagement and public input.

As referenced in the attached electronic mail message from Director of Parks and Recreation Samuel Metott, guidance to this effect will involve public presentations of initial project scope for major projects. These specifically include the Catherine Strong Park Renovation Program, and the Miller Park Pickleball Enhancement Program.

With schematic presentations for both projects anticipated after the beginning of the new year, applicable public outreach meetings will be scheduled soon thereafter.

Calendar of Meetings, Activities, and Functions

The level of excitement and enthusiasm relative to the implementation of pending large scale capital projects and enhancements continues to expand and resonate amongst staff at all levels of the organization. This Tuesday morning the City took part in the groundbreaking ceremony for the future Fire Rescue Station 113 on Linton Boulevard. Notable comments offered during the event related to the pending new police headquarters, as well as upcoming enhancements to other Fire Rescue facilities. Of course, I share in the sentiments, with continuous leadership and guidance being directed to all involved to maintain respective tasks, activities, and trajectory accordingly.

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Given that next business week will be abbreviated due to the Veterans Day holiday weekend, followed by my being away on annual leave during the week of November 13th, as well as the upcoming Thanksgiving Day break, information letters will not be issued during this period. Weekly reporting as noted will therefore resume Friday, December 1st.

Interlocal Service Agreement With the Town of Highland Beach and Selected Administrative Activities and Operations

PRELIMINARY AND TENTATIVE AUDIT FINDINGS NOT AN AUDIT REPORT

SUMMARY

This audit of the City of Delray Beach (City) focused on City compliance with the interlocal service agreement (ISA) with the Town of Highland Beach (Town) for comprehensive fire and emergency medical services and selected City administrative activities and operations. Our audit disclosed the following:

Finding 1: The City's true-up did not adequately represent the actual expenditures incurred as anticipated in the ISA with the Town resulting in underreporting of actual expenditures totaling \$2.2 million for the 2016-17 through 2020-21 fiscal years.

Finding 2: Firefighter salary and benefits amounts recorded in the City's accounting records and billed to the Town did not agree with employee timekeeping records.

Finding 3: City purchasing policies and procedures did not ensure that goods and services ordered, received, and distributed to the Town's fire station were accurately billed to the Town.

Finding 4: For the Town's nonpayment of billed services totaling \$517,654, the City did not timely perform collection efforts nor initiate the ISA provided non-binding mediation process.

Finding 5: During the period October 2019 through December 2022, the City experienced significant turnover in certain key management positions, which may have contributed to the control deficiencies and instances of noncompliance disclosed in this report.

BACKGROUND

In 1911, an area in Palm Beach County west of the Intracoastal Waterway was incorporated as the Town of Delray. In 1923, the area east of the Intracoastal Waterway was incorporated as the Town of Delray Beach. On May 11, 1927, the Town of Delray and the Town of Delray Beach united to form the City of Delray Beach (City). The City has an estimated population of 67,073, and is governed by the City Commission composed of four elected Commissioners and an elected Mayor. The City Commission is responsible for enacting ordinances, resolutions, and policies governing the City, as well as appointing the City Manager. The City Manager serves as the Chief Administrative and Executive Officer and is responsible for the administration of all City affairs.

The City provides a full range of community services including general government administration, police, fire and emergency medical services, sanitation, water and sewer service, recreational and cultural

Good afternoon Terrence,

I am happy to report that activity to move forward with advertising the Marine Way project is moving forward. Within the next couple of weeks, the solicitation for a Construction Engineering and Inspection (CEI) firm will be advertised. Following selection and successful contract negotiation, the Invitation to Bid Construction (ITBC) will be advertised. We are hopeful that both vendors will be on board by the first of the calendar year and that this project will be under construction soon after. The completion of this project will bring the largest section of City-owned seawall into compliance with current ordinance, joining the seawall projects from Veterans Park all the way to the City Marina and completing the City's riverfront walkway along the Intracoastal. Additionally, this project will construct the first Stormwater Pumping Station west of the Intracoastal Waterway within the City's corporate limits. This \$20 million project is funded 50% through a Resilient Florida Grant administered by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection. Below is a rendering of how the final project will look with a brick paver roadway that continues the look of the brick paver walkway in Veterans Park, increased street lighting, and landscaping that pays homage to the streetscape that was present in this area in the 1920s and 30s.



Investigations to complete the seawall from Veterans Park to the City Marina began in 2008 and Staff is very excited to be beginning construction and completing this project in the next couple of years. Please let me know if you have any additional questions or concerns.
