City Commission Information Letter

June 7, 2024

Pompey Park Pool Repair and Reopening

As reported, during the May 21st regular City Commission meeting, both the Office of the City Manager and the Department of Parks and Recreation recently initiated processes necessary to authorize purchase orders and other transactions to perform repairs to the Pompey Park pool facility, enabling timely resumption of operations as our community embarks on the summer season.

As referenced in the attached electronic mail message from Director of Parks and Recreation Sam Metott, direction to this effect involves the replacement of the pool pump filtration system. Equipment and infrastructure to this effect is necessary to not only maintain clean water, but to also increase chlorine efficiency in killing bacteria on a continuous basis.

With work to remove old nonfunctional equipment to begin next week, both reopening of the facility and resumption of normal operations are anticipated early next month.

Meanwhile, while noted maintenance and repair activities are completed at Pompey Park, the Aquatics Division of the Department of Parks and Recreation will facilitate youth-oriented field trips to the Palm Beach County Aqua Crest pool, located on Seacrest Boulevard.

Agreement Extension Considerations for Fire Rescue Services for the Town of Gulf Stream

As the Delray Beach Fire Rescue Department has provided fee for servicebased support for emergency services to the Town of Gulf Stream as noted for 15 years, leadership from that community recently expressed an interest in continuing the respective interlocal agreement.

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Review and consideration to this effect currently involves financial impact analysis to help confirm that all costs associated with emergency services to Gulf Stream as outlined will in no way adversely affect the City of Delray Beach economically, with all associated expenses to be fully realized by the Town of Gulf Stream. Fortunately, unlike the recently concluded service agreement involving the Town Highland Beach, the Gulf Stream environment does not include facilities, shared transactional agreements for vehicles and/or equipment, nor staffing directly assigned to that municipality.

Recommendations for City Commission review and consideration respectively are therefore anticipated in the coming weeks.

Final Account Closure Relative to COVID Provider Relief Funds

With the federal government currently working to close out remaining account balances from COVID related allocations to municipalities throughout the nation, please be advised of final direction to this effect involving the City of Delray Beach.

As referenced in the attached electronic mail message from Chief Financial Officer Hugh Dunkley, conclusion to this effect pertains to a \$84,253 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act allocation specifically awarded in 2020 for ancillary public safety and ambulance related care services. However, due to various miscommunication events in early 2021 involving both internal staff and agents from the City's third-party ambulance billing company, Digitech, direction has since been offered to follow-up with the United States Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) to retroactively submit related financial activity reports.

With the aggregate amount of resulting offsets totaling nearly \$95,000 (the aforementioned \$84,253, as well as associated interests and charges), the Department of Finance will continue to pursue engagement with HHS to provide necessary information to satisfy all remaining reporting requirements.

Adopt-A-Street Program

As the Office of the City Manager has recently been informed relative to interests

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on part of external parties to participate in existing adopt-a-street type programs and initiatives, it was concurrently determined that opportunities that have existed in Delray Beach to this effect operated on a rather informal basis.

Direction is likewise being offered to consider establishing an official Delray Beach opportunity as outlined. As noted in the attached electronic mail message from Director of Neighborhood and Community Services Sam Walthour, guidance to this effect involves creating an official policy to govern associated sponsorship details, as well as related application requirements.

Recommendations for City Commission review and consideration will likewise be offered in the coming weeks. Meanwhile, the Department of Public Works current sign shop organizational structure has the capacity to produce signs for external partners that may become involved accordingly.

Calendar of Meetings, Activities and Functions

Although an initially unexpected amount of time and energy was experienced during past few days relative to external partnership response considerations regarding the Crest Theater building, both the Office of the City Manager and other involved staff members greatly appreciate the opportunity to continue leadership and guidance necessary to achieve desired organizational structure and programming outcomes. This will hopefully include yesterday afternoon's City Commission expressed support for the Downtown Development Authority Board of Directors to collaborate with the City of Delray Beach as outlined, as well as continued vetting and evaluation of 27 Productions for future alignment and synergy that they may be able to offer and contribute.

Subject: CARES Act Provider Relief Fund Program Repayment

Mr. Moore -

On April 10, 2020, the City received Provider Relief Funds (PRF) totaling \$84,252.98 from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services in connection with the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act.

On January 25, 2021, the City received e-mail communication from the City's third-party ambulance billing company, Digitech, the Registered Point of Contact in the PRF Reporting Portal, regarding reporting responsibilities under the PRF which the City failed to take timely action, resulting in the City missing the published deadline for reporting how the aforementioned funds were used.

City staff received subsequent emails from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) regarding the City's appeal rights to which City staff again failed to respond in a timely manner resulting in HHS recouping the PRF funds via reduction of amounts owed to the City. Ambulance transport fees as well as amounts that should have been received by the City for reimbursement of police overtime from the federal government were offset by amounts that the received in PRF funds, including interest. The total amount of offset amounted to \$94,694.72. All of these amounts were accounted for in the City's General Fund.

We will continue our efforts to see if HHS will allow the City to cure this reporting deficiency and will keep you advised accordingly.
