City Commission Information Letter

<u>Trajectory for New Fire Rescue Chief Selection Process</u>

With the recruitment process necessary to select a highly qualified professional to serve as our community's next fire rescue chief now significantly underway, both the Office of the City Manager and that of Director of Human Resources Duane D'Andrea recently convened to outline a projected timeline to conclude hiring as noted.

As referenced in the attached memorandum from Mr. D'Andrea, a total of nine semi-finalists for this opportunity were selected earlier this week. Individual interviews and other evaluation exercises are to likewise take place during the next few weeks, with the goal of identifying several finalists as noted immediately thereafter.

Candidate interviews will involve engagement with a selection committee appointed by the Office of the City Manager, consisting of various members of the City's Executive Leadership Team, and an external subject matter expert such as a fire rescue leader from another area municipality, followed by dialogues with me individually.

Resulting announcements and introduction of the next Delray Beach Fire Rescue Chief is likewise anticipated in the next couple months.

Clarity Regarding Funding for Facility Enhancements at the Delray Beach Tennis Center

Although some initial considerations were offered last year to program 2023 Parks General Obligation Bond resources to help support improvements at the Delray Beach Tennis Center, please be advised that it has since been clarified legally that such an arrangement isn't possible.

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As referenced in the attached electronic mail message from Director of Parks and Recreation Sam Metott, such is a function of bond covenant restrictions for special facilities such as tennis centers, beaches, cemeteries, and other environments that are not traditionally defined as public parks.

However, direction has been initiated to continue a variety of enhancements at the Delray Beach Tennis Center via budgeted Parks and Recreation line-item resources. This includes a current fiscal year commitment of \$500,000 for various related improvements, including public restroom renovations, lighting enhancements, as well as Phase 1 of the stadium seating replacement program.

Meanwhile, direction will continue to deliver a facility that meets Association of Tennis Professionals tour standards, as part of contractual obligations for the annual Delray Beach Open.

Potential Additional Federal Funding for Water Infrastructure

With leadership of the City's federal lobbying firm, The Color Nine Group, having recently advised the Office of the City Manager relative to their efforts to expand funding availability for water related infrastructure improvements via a bill that is currently engaging the United States Senate approval process, please be advised that direction is likewise being offered to prepare specific proposal considerations to support the City of Delray's efforts to this effect. This includes such for water utility related capital improvements, as well as such for our community's wastewater and stormwater systems.

Given the recently communicated focus for external financial assistance and support to advance the City's commitments to improve infrastructure as outlined, the City of Delray Beach's timing regarding this possibility may very well prove to be extremely impeccable.

Point in Time Homelessness Statistics for Delray Beach

Both my office and that of Chief of Police Russ Mager recently hosted a meeting to review and discuss recently provided statistical analysis to help determine homelessness demographics in our community.

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As referenced in the attached electronic mail message and graphical summary from Delray Beach Police Department Service Population Advocate Manager Ariana Ciancio, of an initial total of 109 people in the Delray Beach vicinity (formally recognized as homeless by Palm Beach County since January), the City of Delray Beach was able to identify 106 via its records. This includes individuals that may have been in town for very short periods of time via the library, courthouse, and/or other public venues to secure available services, as well as those incarcerated and/or receiving some form of treatment.

Given the City's recent expansion of assertiveness to manage issues and challenges that have impacted our community as noted, a presentation to help underscore continued efforts and current situations regarding this matter will be offered during the August 19th regular meeting.

Calendar of Meetings, Activities and Functions

In response to interests expressed during Tuesday's budget workshop meeting dialogue relative to an additional millage rate reduction without compromising existing level of service structure, both the Office of the City Manager and the Department of Finance continue to work diligently to identify opportunities to achieve in this regard. This specifically includes identification of ancillary efficiencies in operations, as well as adjustments to capital improvement expenditures to help reduce General Fund dependency as noted to the extent possible.

Final millage rate considerations as obligated for approval this coming Tuesday will likewise yield an updated recommended spending plan for the coming fiscal year, with additional resulting adjustments to be highlighted via September's associated public hearing process.

August 2024: The City Manager will conduct final interviews and make the offer of employment to the selected candidate. Human Resources will complete the onboarding process.

Hello Terrance,

As we discussed we are continuing to improve the tennis stadium to stay in accordance with the ATP standards requirement(s) from the contract for the Delray Beach Open event.

Unfortunately, the tennis center is considered a "special facility" and does not fit the guidelines for funding through the Parks General Obligation Bond.

Last year we instituted an initial phased improvement process that included;

- Lower bowl seating replacement
- Extension of Tennis court 1 (tournament court)
 - New, longer court surface
 - New fencing
 - New led lighting
- Restroom building renovations
 - New urinals/toilets
 - New lighting
 - New partitions
- -Concourse green carpet replacement.

The next phase of improvements include veranda bathroom renovations, stadium grand stand seating, electrical upgrades, media tower improvements, and renovations to the player locker rooms.

Good afternoon Mr. Moore,

Here is a breakdown of the Point in time numbers for the City of Delray 2024 from the Community Outreach Team

As of 6/28/24: Of the 109 people the county identified during point in time, I have 106 identified through our records

Of the 106 individuals identified:

18 have never crossed our path again. They could have just been in the city that day having visited: DAF, SCMHC, DMC, HCD, PBC Courthouse, Palm Beach County HUB or visiting the library

2 of the individuals were not homeless and said they were in order to get gift cards

14 of the individuals are either in jail, treatment or in housing

3 left the city permanently

Since January 2024 we placed 37 people into the shelter

Since January 2024, 7 people have been placed in permanent housing


