City Commission Information Letter

Selection of New Fire Rescue Chief

The Office of the City Manager is pleased to report that the selection process necessary to appoint a new fire rescue chief to serve both our organization and community recently concluded.

Mr. Ronald Martin currently serves as Chief of Safety for the Louisiana Office of the State Fire Marshal. He likewise brings considerable fire rescue and emergency management experience to the City of Delray Beach. Additional professional service to date included service as Fort Myers Beach Fire Control District Fire Chief/District Manager, as well as other leadership positions in that agency over a span of thirteen years.

A native of Northwest Indiana, Mr. Martin's educational background includes an undergraduate degree in business management from Hodges University, as well as a Master of Science in homeland security and emergency management from Long Island University.

As Mr. Martin is currently finalizing applicable pre-employment particulars, his first day of service will be Monday, October 7th. Opportunities for elected officials, department directors, and existing Delray Beach Fire Rescue personnel to welcome Mr. Martin appropriately will likewise be forthcoming as a function of his integration into our municipal operations.

Meanwhile, much appreciation to the interview panel that greatly assisted the Office of the City Manager via the evaluation of candidates that ultimately became finalists for this opportunity. This includes Assistant City Manager Jeff Oris; Chief of Police Russ Mager; Director of Public Works Missie Barletto; Director of Development Services Anthea Gianniotes; Chief Financial Officer Hugh Dunkley; City Attorney Lynn Gelin; Director of Human Resources Duane D'Andrea; and as an external subject matter expert, Boca Raton Fire Rescue Chief John Treanor.

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Finally, a special thank you to Kevin Green for his invaluable service and support as Interim Fire Rescue Chief during this transition period.

Florida Department of Environmental Projection Local Government Funding Request to Help Support Beach Renourishment Program

As the City of Delray Beach prepares to initiate beach renourishment planning activities, both the Office of the City Manager and that of Director of Public Works Missie Barletto are pleased to report that our community is anticipated to secure a funding allocation from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection help support respective efforts.

As referenced in the attached electronic mail message from Ms. Barletto, this anticipated allocation of approximately \$28.5 million will also fulfill the State of Florida's, the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers', and Palm Beach County's obligation to complete our community's beach renourishment project, now anticipated to begin in the coming fiscal year.

Recommendations for formal acceptance and authorization by the City Commission are likewise anticipated during the 2025 state legislative budget process. Meanwhile, much appreciation to Ms. Barletto, Assistant Director of Public Works Cynthia Buisson, and their team for their contributions in helping the City of Delray Beach achieve this much anticipated project via external funding opportunities that may have otherwise not become possible.

Public Engagement Trajectory to Support Input for Parks General Obligation Bond Sponsored Projects

With the City of Delray Beach now in position to administer projects via initial proceeds from the 2023 Parks General Obligation Bond issue, please be advised of efforts currently being developed by leadership of the Department of Parks and Recreation to engage public input and feedback accordingly.

As referenced in the attached electronic mail message from Director of Parks and Recreation Sam Metott, guidance to this effect involves scheduling specific

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meetings in different geographical areas of the community to discuss pending projects, as well as to gather specific feedback for other enhancement opportunities that may have merit.

Direction to this effect, to include community outreach to encourage desired attendance and participation, is therefore anticipated to be initiated beginning next month.

Pending Playground Project to Benefit Carver Park

As the City of Delray Beach continues implementation of its playground renovation initiative, all involved are currently looking forward to the next facility enhancement as outlined to benefit Carver Park.

As was the case with new playground equipment installed in other locations in recent years, Carver Park will experience a more modern structure, to include improved landscaping and surfacing to help achieve a more enjoyable experience for youth visitors in the nearby Carver Square neighborhood.

Given that this opportunity remains available via partnership and collaboration with the Delray Beach Community Redevelopment Agency, recommendations for applicable contract authorization will be offered publicly via a regular City Commission meeting next month.

Calendar of Meetings, Activities and Functions

Given Palm Beach County's current external engagement activities with leadership of incorporated cities relative to long-term transportation master planning considerations, myself, along with leadership of the Department of Public Works and the Department of Development Services will participate in a round table discussion this afternoon to address potential outcomes accordingly.

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While it continues to remain advised that external consultancy services will be retained to help support Palm Beach County's efforts as outlined, the City of Delray Beach, and as I am sure, other area city governments, highly welcome opportunities to contribute specific transportation and related infrastructure observations and challenges uniquely being experienced in each of our communities.

Good Morning Missie,

We've received good news from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) about the State funding cost share of our upcoming full contour beach nourishment project planned for Winter 2025 / 2026, Delray Beach is ranked #3 in the State, and we anticipate receiving our full funding request (\$9.7M). This is in addition to the \$3.8M the State had previously committed to this renourishment project, for a total State cost share of \$13.5M. State funds are made available as a 50/50 cost share for eligible tasks in our beach program.

Other funding partners for the upcoming beach renourishment include the United States Army Corps of Engineers, who is constructing to the federal template for an estimated cost of \$11.16M and Palm Beach County for an estimated \$3.78M.

I will keep you posted with updates as we move forward towards construction engineering and agreements with our funding partners.
