REVISED PUBLIC NOTICE: VARIANCE

A petition has been received from Beantown Real Estate Investments, LLC, property owner, requesting Variances from Land Development Regulations (LDR) Section 4.3.4(K) for the property located at **1120 Nassau Street** which is on the south side of Nassau Street between Gleason Street and S. Ocean Boulevard, within the **Nassau Park Historic District**.

The subject property is legally described as:

The east 35.5 feet of lot 15 and the west 19.5 feet of lot 16, of Nassau Park, as shown on the Plat recorded in Plat Book 16, page 67, of the public records of Palm Beach County.

The requested variances are from LDR Section 4.3.4(K) as follows:

- Reduce the front setback from the required 25' to 14.4' on the north side of the property;
- Reduce the side interior setback from the required 7'6" to 6'6" on the east side of the property; and,
- Reduce the side interior setback from the required 7'6" to 4'1½" on the west side of the property.

The Historic Preservation Board will conduct a public hearing on **Wednesday**, **August 7**, **2019 at 6:00 P.M.** (or at any continuation of such meeting which is set by the Historic Preservation Board) in the City Commission Chambers at City Hall, 100 NW 1st Avenue, Delray Beach, Florida, for the purpose of receiving public comment.
