The City recently approved waivers for two separate projects to allow applicants to place subgrade parking garages within the required site setbacks: The Ray, and PHG Delray. During the consideration of the PHG waiver request at the December 10, 2019 City Commission meeting, the Commission directed staff to update the Land Development Regulations (LDRs) to streamline the review process and allow subgrade parking within the setbacks, by right. Updates are proposed to the following sections of the LDRs:

- Section 4.3.4(H(4))
- Section 4.4.13(D)(1)&(2)
- Section 4.6.9(D)1)
